1. Twitter Campaign: Reading is important because...

You will find printable signs in English, French, Spanish, Arabic, and Khmer in this kit. Please print the signs and have your staff, friends and family share why reading is important to them.

Photograph people holding their completed signs (landscape) and tweet on your accounts (or email to inuri@urc-chs.com if you would rather we post it from the @GblReadingNtwk account).

We encourage you to post these photos to Twitter in the week leading up to International Literacy Day and repost on the actual day.

PHOTO TIP: Take your photos in landscape (long width), not portrait, so you can easily optimize them for social media

Please do:

- Check that your signs are legible—use a thick pen or marker
- Include #ILD15 and @GblReadingNtwk in your tweet so we can find and retweet your photos.
- Encourage others to download the signs and participate (use http://bit.ly/LiteracyDayGRN to link to resources).

Helpful hints for successful tweeting:

- Keep it short. Tweets of 100 characters or less leave room for retweeting.
- Get the attention of other literacy and education advocacy organizations by using their Twitter handles in your tweets. For instance, to make sure the Global Reading Network sees your tweets: Join @GblReadingNtwk & support early #reading efforts.

2. Video: Let's Get Creative!

Now if holding a sign is not your thing, how about producing a very short video on why reading is important? Videos are meant to make conversations more spontaneous, visual and fun!

Follow these steps:

- Record your video
- Post it on your Social Media Network using our hashtags (#ILD15, #LiteracyDay, and #AllChildrenRead)

NOTE: Because the Global Reading Network focuses on primary grade reading, photos and videos of children are encouraged, as are messages from adults about the importance of literacy!


